Outside we are exploring too, we love going down the slide and are learning how movement can make marks as we use the chunky chalks on the path.

#### **HOME LEARNING IDEAS**

Cardboard Boxes - next time you get an amazon delivery save the boxes, what could you make? a garage, a castle, a cave, a car, a jewellery box, a pen pot.... the possibilities are endless! If you have a large piece of cardboard why not draw around your child and let them colour themselves in! You could talk about parts of the body and what jobs they have, you could look at details such as hair and eye colour. Show us your creations, pop a photo on EYLOG.

An Autumn walk - There's nothing better than kicking up and running through fallen leaves. Make a pile, throw them up, jump in them, kick them, roll around in them, laugh and have fun with your child! Take a few home to make leaf prints or a glue and stick picture. Take a bag, what else can you collect on your walk? Feathers, conkers, seed heads, acorns, sticks. Play a sorting game when you get home, count the objects, talk about which is heavy and light. Fill a bucket with water, which ones float, which ones sink. Where did that feather even come from anyway? The natural world is a magical wonderous place, enjoy it with your child :-)



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<u>Rip it up! -</u> toddlers like to rip, they like the sound, they like the movement and it's perfect for developing those fine motor skills. If you've a pile of magazines or newspapers you're throwing away, give them to your little one and let them tear away!

<u>Building towers/Stacking -</u> no need for building blocks with this simple activity, just empty your plastic containers from the kitchen cupboards and see what you can build!

<u>Feeding babies/teddies -</u> pop a plastic sheet on the floor, sit teddy on, then add a bowl with water (coloured if you have any food colouring) and a spoon. Encourage your child to feed their toys - another good activity to help with fine motor!
